
## August walk




We walked down Ainsworth Hall Road and passed Greenside




At Ainsworth Hall Farm, we turned right along Old Wood Lane – the footpath used by the villagers, but now rather overgrown

We shouted – but there was no response


And so we were lost and abandoned!!
