William worked on the railways, at Knowsley St Station Goods Dept for 38 years, according to some biographical notes his wife, Sally (Sarah Alice)made, when she was in her 80's. She says they rented a double fronted cottage at Three Arrows in 1916, and stayed there 30 years. After a few months she got permission from the landlady to open a shop in it as there were no shops nearby.

There is a postcard , dated 1918? (it's difficult to read the postmark) addressed to them at 5 Starling ${\rm Road}$



and there is an entry in the Bolton Directory for 1927 "Mrs Sarah A Greenhalgh, grocer, 5 Starling Road.



At some point William opened the Hut on the main road opposite the pub, and by the late 40's they lived in Thompson Ave, and eventually were the first tenants of the new "old folks' bungalows", at 5 Moorside Ave.
